Wallace Whittaker, Inland Manager, Air Corps Major



Wallace S. Whittaker, general manager of the Inland Manufacturing division of General Motors corporation, has obtained leave of absence for the duration in order that he may join the United States air forces.

Whittaker will be a major in the air service command of the Army air forces and will report for service June 25. He has not been given definite assignment as yet, but will report to Washington.

His successor at the Inland, which, like other General Motors divisions, is devoted to war work, has not been named.

The Whittakers reside at 235 Thruston boulevard. Mrs. Whittaker will remain in Dayton while her husband is in the service, it was said today.


Whittaker has been an employe of General Motors since 1922 and has been general manager of Inland since 1924. Prior to taking on war work, the plant was engaged in manufacturing rubber articles, mainly steering wheels and refrigerator trays and other small parts.

Whittaker, 50, was born in Lakewood, N. Y., and attended school at Hotchkiss, Lakeville, Conn., and Yale, where he received the degree of bachelor of science in 1914.
