**Voices Of 100 Will Be Heard
On Broadcast**

DAYTON, Dec. 24—Broadcast over a national radio hook-up of more than 100 stations on the Columbia Broadcasting System network, a special Christmas Eve program by the famous Children's Chorus of the Inland Manufacturing Division of General Motors Corporation, in Dayton, will be heard Wednesday at 10:15 P. M.

Now in its sixth season, the Inland Children's Chorus has achieved a noteworthy reputation, under the direction of Richard Westbrook, through constant and exacting training routines which give the chorus professional finesse despite the fact that members do no professional singing. All are children of Inland employes, and range in age from eight to 15 years.

The Children's Chorus now has a membership of some 170. For concert work, 100 members are chosen on a competitive basis.
