Inland Children's Chorus Will Make Christmas Appearance

THE Inland Children's chorus will make its ninth annual guest appearance with the Dayton Philharmonic orchestra at Memorial hall Sunday, Dec. 16, at 3 p. m. The children, whose training under the direction of Richard Westbrook is sponsored by the Inland division of General Motors Corp., are children of the plant's employes. One hundred young singers make up the group.

For their appearance with the orchestra under the direction of Paul Katz the children will sing the Gloria from Mozart's Twelfth Mass, a group of traditional Christmas carols and Tales from the Vienna Woods by Strauss. Westbrook will direct the chorus in a cappella group including McClosky's Iris, a Russian folk song and the Shepherds' Story.

The orchestra's share of the con-

cert will be the performance of Corelli's Christmas concerto; the Berlioz Roman Carnival overture, the prelude to Moussorgsky's Khovanchina and Tschaikowsky's 1812 overture.

The Inland Children's chorus will also present its Christmas eve program on the air, at which time the children will present "The Story of Bethlehem," and a number of favorite Christmas carols. The

program will be presented over station WHIO at 6:30 p. m., and station WING at 8:30 p. m.

On Monday night, Dec. 17, the chorus will give a special concert at Memorial hall for the employes and guests of Inland.

The program presented at this concert will be the same as given in the appearance with the orchestra with the exception that the musical background will be furnished by organ and piano music under Westbrook's direction.

Inland Children's Chorus To Present Concert Dec. 16

The annual Christmas concert of the Inland Children's chorus will be given with the Dayton Philharmonic orchestra at 3 p. m. Sunday, Dec. 16, in Memorial hall. It is to be noted that this year there will be only one concert by this popular singing group.

The chorus was organized 10 years ago in order to give the children of Inland employes a musical education which they would not be able to otherwise enjoy. Under the direction from the start of Richard Westbrook, the group of 50 girls and 50 boys, has made a notable contribution to the cultural life of Dayton.

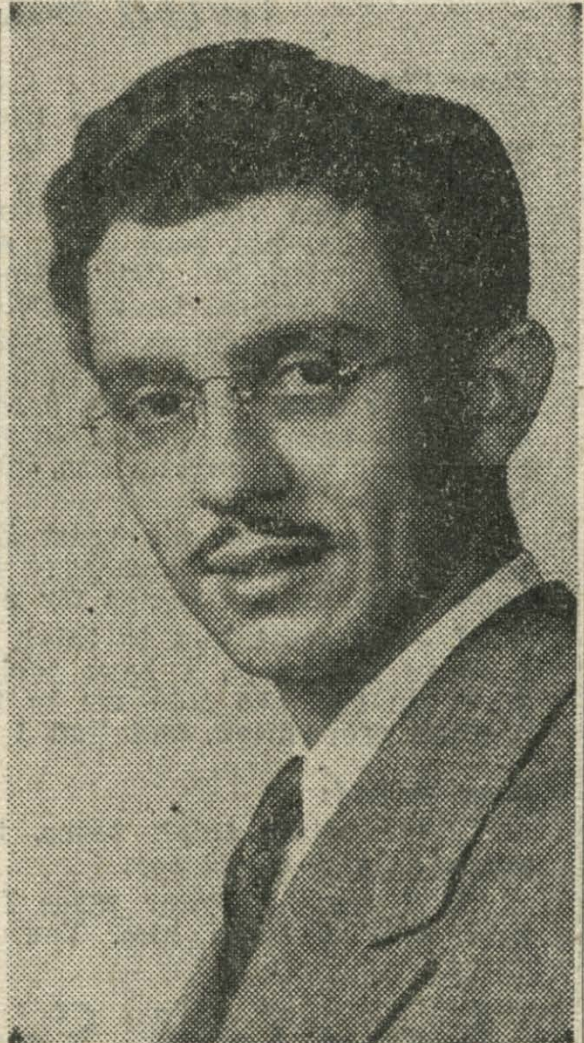
