

Inland Children's Chorus Is To Sing At Institute Today

THE Inland Children's chorus, directed by Richard Westbrook, will be presented twice this afternoon at the Dayton Art Institute. The program will be given at 2 and 4 p. m. as part of the series sponsored by the Chamber of Commerce and the Art Institute. The concert is open to the public.

The program will include the Crucifixus from the Bach Mass in

B Minor and O Bone Jesu by Palestrina. Secular portion of the program will include a Sorrento folk song, Deep Purple, an Appalachian folk song and Malaguena. Isabel Herbst is accompanist for the group.

The chorus, which was organized by Westbrook for the Inland division of General Motors here, is now entering its 16th season. The children who make up the ensemble are from eight to 16 years of age. They are all members of families of Inland employes.
