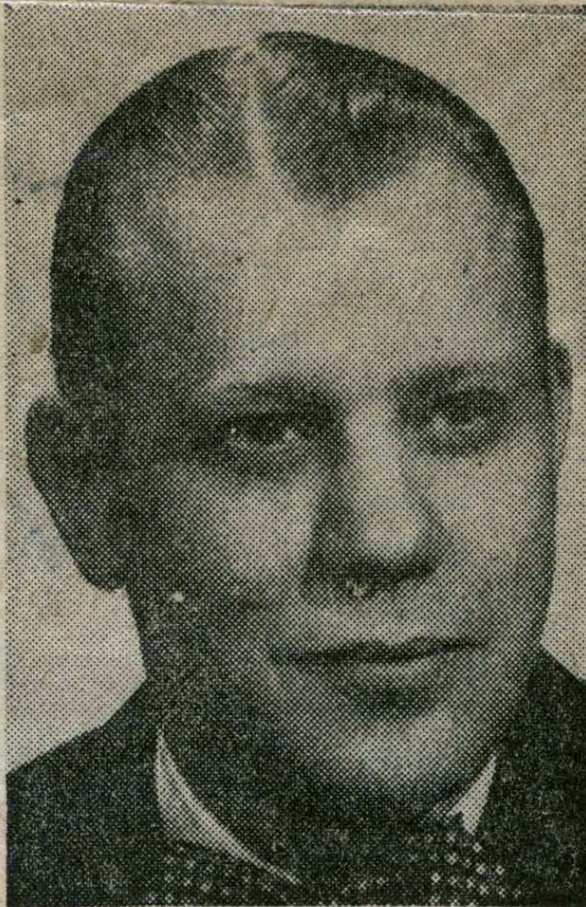

Mr. Geiger recently succeeded the late Richard Westbrook as director of the choral group. The former was graduated from the College of Music, Cincinnati, and the University of Cincinnati. He majored in piano, organ and Gregorian chant. He has had 27 years of concert work and has devoted much time to training voices of young people and children. He is organist and choirmaster at St. Mary's.

The 100-voiced concert group will present, among other selections, Berlin's "Give Me Your Tired, Your Poor," Kern's "Look for the Silver Lining," the Monk-Wilson "Abide With Me" and Franck's "Panis Angelicus."

The chorus will sing, too, Herbert's "Because You're Here," Dickson's "Thanks Be to God" and Moller's "Happy Wanderer."

Clyde Parks will be chairman for the concert.
