Ardmore Civic Chorus will begin its 11th year Oct. 7 under the direction of a newcomer, Lt. William E. McCord, Ardmore Air Force Base. In the Air Force 2½ years, including the past 12 months here, he is originally from Dayton, Ohio.

He graduated from Ball State Teachers College, Muncie, Ind., where he majored in music education and has studied voice with Carl Nelson, Douglas MacCash and O. E. Gebhardt. In college he was affiliated with the Dutch Club, a men's chorus directed by Gebhardt.
