Expect Large Audience For Chorus Festival

Inland people and their friends, who in recent years have had difficulty in hearing and seeing the Children's Chorus Spring Festival because of limited seating capacity, will not have that trouble Sunday afternoon, April 28.

The 1957 Festival will be pre-

sented in spacious and beautifully remodeled Memorial Hall at 3:30 p.m., where almost 3,000 comfortable theater type seats are available.

Thus, there should be room for all. Admission is free but will be by ticket only. Tickets may be

obtained at four convenient locations: Personnel Activities, Main Lobby and the Medical Depts., of Bldgs. 27 and 50.

The 100-voice Concert group of 50 boys and 50 girls will offer a two-part program of 10 arrangements that will bring the beauty of Easter and the new hope of Spring to the audience.

Under the direction of Joseph P. Geiger, the children accompanied by Paul Ray Jones will sing in the first part: "The Lord's Prayer," "O Divine Redeemer," "Regina Coeli," "Look for the Silver Lining" and "America Our Heritage," which will be followed by a Prayer.

Following intermission, the Chorus will present: "Easter Parade," selections from "The King and I," "That Lucky Old Sun," "Gay Ninety Medley," "Battle Hymn of the Republic," and the encore "Good Night Sweetheart."
